Presidents Message





It is a great honour and pleasure for Frankfurter Golf Club to host the European Ladies' Amateur Championship in July 2025. Our club is one of the oldest in Germany, founded 1913 by the Frankfurt industrialist and generous patron Carl von Weiberg. Our 18-hole championship course is located just a 10-minute drive from the main train station in the natural surroundings of the Frankfurt city forest. Harry S. Colt and John Morrison designed the course in the late 1920s, masterfully utilizing natural features of the terrain. The course received a "facelift" in 2007 with the renovation of the greens and surroundings by the German architect Christoph Städler. From our signature hole, the 18th, players and visitors can enjoy a magnificent view of today's Frankfurt skyline.

Until 1989, our club regularly hosted the German Open and since then, major national and international tournaments have taken place here, in particular for the Ladies. We are thrilled to host this Ladies' amateur tournament as one of EGA's flagship events in 2025 and look forward to welcoming the best European amateur Ladies' players along with representatives from the European Golf Association and the German Golf Association. All our staff and volunteers are dedicated to present a championship course in excellent condition and to create a warm and welcoming atmosphere.

Venue

Frankfurter Golf Club e.V.

The Frankfurt Golf Club is one of the oldest golf clubs in Germany, founded in 1913. An impressive tree population lines the fairways of the 18-hole parkland course designed by Harry S. Colt in the Frankfurt city forest.

Around 1400 members, including around 300 children and young people have their sporting home here. No other major German city has a full-fledged golf course that can be reached in just ten minutes from the main train station and the city center. An 18-hole round with a view of the striking Frankfurt skyline from the natural oasis of our championship course is a lasting experience for every golfer!
