TEAM FEE

The team fee to be paid directly to the French Golf Federation is €700 per team. It covers transfers between the official airport and the official hotel, practice balls, pull trolleys, yardage books, team photographs, and social events (for 4 players and a captain).

The participation fee for additional individuals travelling with the teams is €150 per person. It covers transfers between the official airport and the official hotel, as well as social events. This fee will be paid together with the team fee.

The total amount of the team fees must be paid by bank transfer to the account of the French Golf Federation (please see the bank details above) **by Tuesday 1st July.**

REGISTRATION

Registration is open on Tuesday 22nd and Wednesday 23rd July.

Participating teams are requested to register at the Club House immediately upon arrival, no later than Wednesday 23 July 12:00pm noon. Failure to register or to notify the Committee in advance of arrival time may result in the team losing its reserved starting field place.

PRIZES

The winner of the Championship in each of the Girls' and Boys' categories shall be the European Young Masters Champion.

In each category, the winner will be presented a trophy and receive a golf medal, the runner up, a silver medal and the third-placed competitor, a bronze medal.

The EGA will present medals to the members of the three lowest scoring teams in the Nations' Cup, and a trophy to the winning team.

CLUB HISTORY

La Boulie, one of the most prestigious golf clubs in France, was founded in 1901 by Pierre Deschamps and his associates under the name Société du Golf de Paris. Their goal was to create a golf course near Paris, the first in the capital. The course was designed by Scottish architect Willie Park Junior, and an Anglo-Norman style clubhouse was inaugurated in 1904.

The history of La Boulie can be divided into two main periods. The first, from 1901 to 1951, is marked by significant events such as the first French Open in 1906, won by Arnaud Massy. In 1911, a 9-hole course was added to accommodate the growing number of members. In 1913, the club hosted a historic match between the best French and American golfers, with France emerging victorious. During the World Wars, the site underwent several changes: it was converted into a military hospital during World War I, occupied by the Germans during World War II, and turned into allotment gardens after the war. In 1951, the majority of the shares were sold.

The second period began in 1951, when the Racing Club de France took control of the club. Pierre Prieur, a passionate golfer, oversaw its restoration, and in 1952, the La Vallée course reopened after 15 months of renovation under the direction of landscaper Jacques Roussel. The club hosted several major international events, including nine editions of the French Open, the 1963 Golf World Cup, and numerous other competitions. In 1968, a second course, La Forêt, was opened, bringing the total number of holes to 45.

Today, La Boulie is an iconic venue in French golf, hosting prestigious tournaments and boasting a rich history that has spanned several eras.

COURSE

La Vallée – 1901

La Vallée is the first golf course built in the Paris region, established in 1901. Its winding and hilly layout, which was innovative for its time, was designed by Scottish architect Willie Park Jr, a two-time winner of The Open Championship and one of the most renowned golf course architects of the early 20th century. The course hosted the first French Open in 1906, won by the club's professional, Arnaud Massy. Devastated during World War II, it was rebuilt in 1951 according to its original design, with some necessary modifications and adjustments after the passage of German tanks. La Vallée has been the venue for 19 editions of the French Open, a World Cup in 1963, and numerous prestigious tournaments such as the Perrier Open (1988 and 1991). The course has seen many golf legends, including Arnaud Massy, Byron Nelson, Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus, Severiano Ballesteros, Fred Couples, and Tiger Woods during the 1994 Amateur World Championship.

Now a legendary course, La Vallée is not very long but is quite technical. Its narrow fairways, lined with trees of various species, along with steep slopes and numerous undulations, represent the main challenge of the course. The terrain is never flat! The large, deep greens allow for multiple pin positions, ranging from simple to very challenging. They are protected by many deep bunkers, requiring precise short game skills.

The course record of 61 is still held by Severiano Ballesteros, set in 1986 during the Pro-Am of the French Open.

➤ *Club House*

The club house facilities are available for players and officials during the championship daily from 6:30 am.

➤ *Restaurant – Le 1882 (La Boulie Golf Club restaurant)*

The golf course restaurant will offer you a buffet lunch for 25€. In order to manage payments, teams will be required to open an account upon arrival.

➤ *Internet*

Free Wireless Internet connection is available in the club house.

➤ *Bag Storage*

Golf bags storage will be available in the club house from Monday 21st to Sunday 27th of July. If you travel with trolleys, please contact the Tournament Office upon arrival.

➤ *Trolleys*

Manual golf trolleys will be available for free. Electric trolleys are forbidden during training and tournament days.

➤ *Locker Rooms*

A women and a men's locker room will be available. Lockers will be provided for each team.

➤ *Dress Code*

All competitors are kindly asked to dress appropriately throughout the whole event. Casual and clean golf clothing is required on the course and in the clubhouse. No caps indoor! Participating teams are recommended to perform in national playing uniform. All team members are required to wear their national uniforms during all official ceremonies.

➤ *Water refill points:*

Don't forget to bring a reusable water bottle, as refill stations will be available along the course.

➤ *Training areas*

The driving range and a putting green area are located near the club house.

The chipping green area is located just next to 9th green.

Please leave the practice facilities in the same condition you found them. Please replace divots and use your own golf balls when practicing on the short game area.

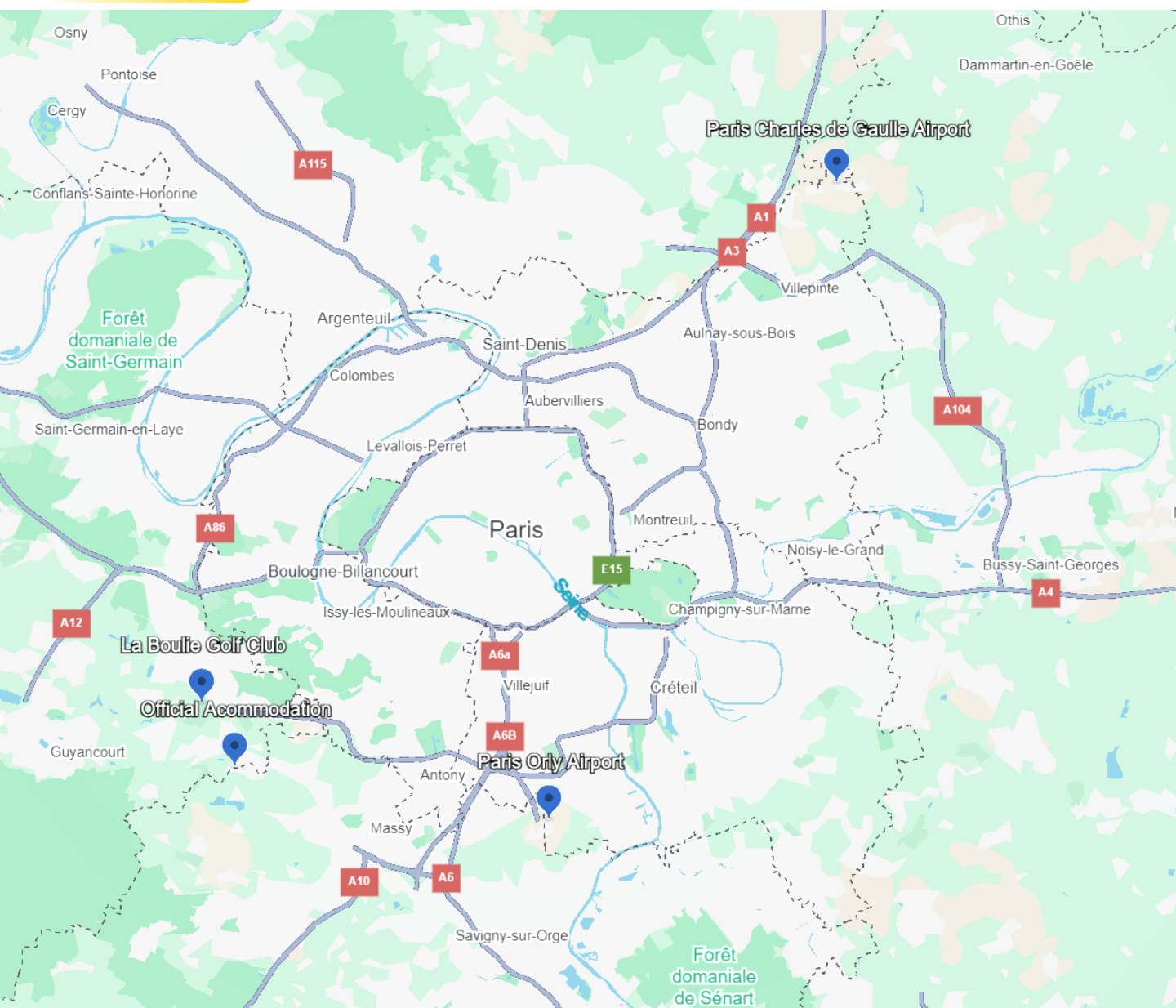
