## CLUB HISTORY

The Royal Golf Club of Belgium, founded in 1906 by **King Leopold II**, initially encompassed both the **Ravenstein course** near Brussels and the **Ostend links**. However, after World War II, the two clubs separated. The club's historic centerpiece, the Ravenstein Manor Farm, dates back to 1460 and has passed through the hands of various noble owners before being gifted to the **Royal Donation by King Leopold II in 1903**. The course is renowned for its impressive variety of tree species, reflecting the King's passion for dendrology.

While the original 18-hole course is often attributed to Seymour Dunn, some believe that renowned golf architect Tom Simpson also played a role in shaping its design during the 1920s. In 1951, Philip Mackenzie Ross further expanded the club's offerings by designing the 9-hole Park Course, providing an additional space for recreational golfers. **Today, the Royal Golf Club of Belgium remains one of the most prestigious and historically rich golf courses in the country.**

## DRESS CODE

### General:

Track suits and training shoes are not permitted.

Collared shirts must be worn and tucked in at all times.

The Jacques Léglise Trophy is played between two teams of nine under 18 male amateur golfers representing Great Britain & Ireland and the Continent of Europe. The match will comprise four morning foursomes followed by eight afternoon singles on day one and nine afternoon singles on day two.
