VENUE

REAL CLUB DE LA PUERTA DE HIERRO

The Real Club de la Puerta de Hierro is located four kilometres away from the centre of Madrid and was founded in 1895. It is considered one of the most important clubs in Europe at the level of facilities.

The original golf course was designed by the English H.S. Colt in 1914, one of the main designers that golf has given. It tells among his works fields as prestigious as Wentworth, Royal Lytham, Muirfield or Pine Valley. The original design underwent modifications in 1924 by Tom Simpson and by Colt himself in 1931. 13 holes of this route disseminated by the fields above and down.

In 1949 the club made an extension of the tour, incorporating another 9 holes, the work of the English architect Tom Simpson, who lived in the club for three years (1946-1949). The extension to 36 holes occurred in 1968, the work of John Harris and that configured the fields above and below a similar way to the one we know today.

In 1998 there was an integral remodelling of the field below by Robert Trent Jones Jr. to which a reform of bunkers, tees and greens by Kyle Phillips in the field above followed.

At the level of amateurs competitions, the RCPH has housed the Eisenhower Trophy, the Bonallack Trophy, the European Amateur Championship, Mid-Am European Championship, all important tournaments in Spain, etc.

At the professional level, it has hosted the Spanish Open 15 times between 1912 and 1961 and 26 Madrid Open counting among its winners Severiano Ballesteros (3 Madrid Open), Bernard Langer (1 Madrid open), Ian Woosnam (1 Madrid Open) and Sandy Lyle (1 Madrid Open).



ST. ANDREWS TROPHY HISTORY



The St Andrews Trophy is a biennial match between elite male amateur golfers from the Continent of Europe and Great Britain & Ireland (GB&I). First contested in 1956, it is the oldest event involving the European Golf Association (EGA). The match is played over two days with nine-player teams, featuring foursomes matches in the morning and singles matches in the afternoon. Traditionally dominated by GB&I, the event has become more competitive in recent years, with the Continent of Europe winning three of the last five matches. The event will shift to odd years from 2025 when it is played at Real Club de la Puerta de Hierro in Spain.

Many of Europe's top golfers have competed in the St Andrews Trophy. Notable former participants from the Continent of Europe include Sami Valimaki, Guido Miglioni, Martin Kaymer, Edoardo Molinari, Francesco Molinari, Henrik Stenson, Sergio Garcia, Thomas Björn, Gonzalo Fernandez-Castano, Jose Maria Olazabal, Peter Hanson, Mikko Ilonen, Jean Van de Velde, and Alexis Godillot.

On the Great Britain & Ireland side, notable participants have included Rory McIlroy, Robert Macintyre, Oliver Fisher, Eddie Pepperell, Paul Casey, Luke Donald, Colin Montgomerie, Jamie Donaldson, Padraig Harrington, Shane Lowry, Darren Clarke, Gary Wolstenholme, Sir Michael Bonallack, Peter McEvoy, and Sandy Lyle.
