

EGA ANTI-DOPING POLICY APPLICABLE TO ALL EGA CHAMPIONSHIPS

All players must comply with the applicable National Anti-Doping laws and regulations as well as with the governing body Anti-Doping regulations.

Players are also required to adhere to and be bound by any additional anti-doping provisions specified in the Terms of Competition for the championship or specific Anti-Doping requirements.

For reference and educational purposes players can also refer to the International Golf Federation (IGF) Anti-Doping Policy, which incorporates the latest Prohibited List issued by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).

Players who are taking medication, or who are uncertain as to the status of any substance or method, must seek appropriate guidance in advance from their National Anti-Doping Organization (NADO). Where required, a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) must be applied for through the relevant NADO and obtained by NADO and/or the relevant approval authority.

Players may also seek guidance from their NADO and/or National federations as well as from the EGA as early as possible and, in any event, no later than 30 days prior to the commencement of the relevant championship.

Players are reminded that anti-doping regulations operate under the principle of strict liability. Each player is solely responsible for any prohibited substance found in his or her sample, regardless of whether the presence of such prohibited substance was intentional or unintentional. Ignorance of the applicable anti-doping regulations may lead to inadvertent substance misuse, anti-doping rule violations, competition disqualification, forfeiture of awards, and/or bans. Accordingly, players are strongly encouraged to undertake anti-doping education as an essential measure in protecting their integrity and sporting career.
